<p>Specific goals are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) identify collaborative practice opportunities among the faculty and clinicians at the Center for Dentistry</li><li>2) create an interprofessional learning community at the Center for Dentistry</li><li>3) pilot and evaluate a model of team based care</li></ol> <p>In collaboration with University of Purple Schools of Dentistry (SoD), Pharmacy (SoPh) Social Work (SoSW) and Nursing (SoN) faculty, Center staff and mentors, we will create a learning community at the Center for Dentistry for the purposes of improving the quality and safety of team-based care.</p> <p>We will spend one week at the Center for Dentistry observing, assessing, and identifying opportunities for permanent interprofessional clinical practice. We will collaborate with faculty in each of the schools to create and plan clinical experiences and QI projects that align with patient centered safety initiatives and IPE competencies. Students will learn how to engage in team-based care, increase awareness of respective roles and responsibilities, and promote an understanding of interprofessional values and ethics. Last, we will create an initial plan for, and pilot collaborative faculty practice opportunities among dental and nurse practitioners at the Center.</p>
<b>Assessment Design:</b>
<p>Indicators of short-term success will include faculty openness to envisioning a collaborative practice, placement of students in the Center for clinical experiences, and the development of a plan for collaborative practice endorsed by the Center. The project will adopt a developmental evaluation approach and will include both formative and summative methods along two domains: the ability to create sustainable learning opportunities for interprofessional collaborations and the ability to establish the Center as a model of team-based health care. Using an iterative approach, feedback and discussions with stakeholders will guide the identification, design and implementation of learning and practice opportunities and will begin to build the foundation for a model collaborative practice site.</p>
